- 1. <u>Call to Order and Roll Call</u>. Chairman Hamman, called the Water Trust Board ("WTB") meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established.
- 2. <u>Approval of Agenda</u>. Member Forte made a motion for approval of the agenda, seconded by Member Lucero. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.
- 3. <u>Approval of the August 18, 2022, Board Minutes</u>. Member Lucero made a motion, seconded by Member Forte, to approve the minutes of the August 18, 2022, meeting. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

4. <u>Cost Overrun Award Update – La Cueva MDWCA 5425-WPF21</u>. Ms. Angela Quintana, Senior Program Administrator

Cost overrun award update for La Cueva MDWCA ("Association") on their 2021 WTB project #5425-WPF21.

The Water Trust Board ("WTB") at its April 13, 2022, meeting, approved the balance from 2021 canceled projects and the 2022 Water Trust Fund distribution be set aside for shortfalls in construction costs for the 2021 and 2022 awards.

The Association was awarded \$713,990 in the 2021 cycle for the construction of a supplemental water supply well. In August 2022, the Association went out to bid with the lowest bid coming in higher than the available funding for the supplemental water supply well. The Association requested \$105,100 of additional funds to complete the project. The \$105,100 will cover the total construction cost plus a 5% contingency.

NMFA staff with the concurrence of our technical partners, NM Environment Department-Construction Programs Bureau recommended the additional amount of \$105,100 to be delivered as a 100% grant.

The New Mexico Finance Authority Board approved the recommendation at its September 22, 2022, meeting.

5. <u>Project Cost Overrun Assistance Process Recommendation</u>. Ms. Angela Quintana, Senior Program Administrator

The process and criteria for Water Trust Board projects awarded in the 2021 and 2022 cycle seeking additional funds because of construction cost overruns.

The Water Trust Board ("WTB") at its April 13, 2022, meeting, approved the balance from 2021 canceled projects and the 2022 Water Trust Fund distribution be set aside for possible shortfalls in construction costs for the 2021 and 2022 awards.

The WTB is tasked with recommending a list of qualified projects for funding to the New Mexico Finance Authority ("NMFA"). The NMFA provides financial assistance for qualified projects as recommended by the WTB under policies jointly established by the WTB and NMFA.

Since the WTB does not meet monthly, staff is proposing a process to provide those awardees timelier access to the set-aside funds.

Once staff receives a formal request for a construction shortfall, staff will require at a minimum:

- Verification of construction costs at the time of the bid.
- Concurrence from technical partners (if applicable); and

• Financial capacity of the entity.

If an entity cannot internally provide the shortfall of funds due to an increase in construction costs and requires additional funds from the set-aside, staff will make a recommendation to the NMFA Board based on the financial capacity of the entity as prescribed by the Water Trust Board Project Management Policies for an amendment to the existing funding agreement.

At the next WTB Board meeting following NMFA Board approval, staff will provide an update to the WTB on the use of the set-aside funds.

Staff recommends approval of the process and criteria for project cost overrun assistance from the set-aside for the 2021 and/or 2022 WTB awardees.

Member Lucero made a motion, seconded by Member Forte to concur with staff's recommendation to approve the process and criteria for project cost overrun assistance for the 2021 and/or 2022 WTB awardees. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

6. <u>Consideration and Recommendation of the 2023 Water Project Fund Waiver Requests</u>. Ms. Angela Quintana, Senior Program Administrator

Consideration of requests from 2023 Water Trust Board (WTB) applicants for waivers to WTB policies.

The 2023 WTB application cycle process provides that projects are evaluated in the fall based upon health and safety factors, and those that are recommended to the Legislature for authorization are then invited to complete a readiness application, which gauges regulatory and policy compliance.

The Preliminary Expenditure Target ensures that applicants timely expend outstanding project funds. Specifically, Section 2.1, Recommendation to the Legislature, requires that the preliminary expenditure target be met at the time the Project Application is submitted. For the 2023 cycle, the preliminary expenditure target date was September 23, 2022. Applicants unable to meet the expenditure target by September 23 were instructed to include a waiver request within their application. Applications not meeting the preliminary expenditure target and not being granted waivers by the Board will not continue in the evaluation process. Every entity with outstanding WTB balances was notified of the policy requirement and the deadline date to meet that requirement in early July as well as part of the NOI review (August 1 – August 15, 2022).

The maximum amount of funds anticipated at this time to be available for the 2023 cycle is \$93.3 million (9% STB + WTF distribution – OSE adjudication). Per policy, Applicants may not receive more than 15% of the available funds in any year, the 15% CAP this year is \$13.9 million.

For the 2023 cycle, twelve waiver requests were submitted for the Preliminary Expenditure Target. The Project Review Committee did not establish a quorum; therefore, the waiver requests were reviewed without recommendations. Below are the requested waivers and staff recommendations:

a) Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority, Watershed Restoration and Management Project; (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has two outstanding 2021 awards (\$9,708,271) with a current combined balance of \$8,070,471 (17% expended). The Authority anticipates project completion of project #5401-WPF by December 2022; project #5402-WPF is anticipated to begin in January 2023.

b) **Buena Vista MDWCA**, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2019 award (\$499,999) with a current balance of \$459,884 (8% expended). The Association's Board turnover and easement issues delayed the project. The project has been awarded and the Association anticipates completion of the 2019 project by December 2022.

c) Chapelle MDWCA, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2019 award (\$565,000) with the full balance remaining (0% expended). The project was delayed due to ROW, easements, and utility permitting. The project has since gone out to bid and awarded. The Association anticipates project completion by February 2023.

d) Claunch Pinto SWCD, Watershed Restoration and Management Project (2), (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has two outstanding 2020 awards (\$1,200,000) and two outstanding 2021 awards \$1,200,000) with a combined balance of \$1,483,835 (38% expended). In 2020, the district's contractors shut down, and some decided not to reopen their businesses or were unable to find employees to work. Because of the fires in Northern New Mexico, many of the current contractors were working on the fire lines and post-fire recovery. The district is currently seeking out-of-state contractors to assist in completing some of the work. The district's 2020 awards will be completed by December 2022 and the 2021 awards will be completed by the Summer of 2023 (winter weather conditions permitting).

e) Eastern NMWUA, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 35%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2021 award (\$7,708,272) with a current balance of \$7,662,023 (1% expended). The Authority received \$177.4 million in federal funds that will be distributed over a five-year period. Due to the additional federal funds, additional mandatory components are required, specifically, the "Build America, Buy America Act" requirements. The Authority extended the RFP proposal from June 15, 2022, to September 28, 2022, to provide additional time for interested contractors. The Authority anticipates awarding the project and notice-to-proceed by December 2022.

f) El Salto MDWCA, Water Conservation or Treatment, Recycling or Reuse Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2021 award (\$1,500,000) with a current balance of \$141,174 (6% expended). The project is currently awaiting drilling permits from the Office of the State Engineer.

g) Los Alamos County, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has a 2020 (\$900,000) and 2021 (\$2,500,000) outstanding awards with full balances remaining (0% expended). The County has gone out to bid on both projects. Due to continued supply delays, the construction of the 2020 project will begin in November 2022 and the 2021 project in February 2023.

h) Rio Lucio MDWCA, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target -70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2021 award (\$750,500) with a current balance of \$747,828 (>1% expended). Securing ROW, easements, and utility permits during the design phase delayed the project. The Association anticipates awarding the project by late October 2022.

i) City of Roswell, Flood Prevention and Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2021 project (\$750,000) with a current balance of \$713,990 remaining (>5% expended). Repairing of utility failures in the project area prevented the project from moving forward. The project is expected to commence in early November with an anticipated completion date of February 2023.

j) Sangre de Cristo MDWC&SWA, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2020 award (\$121,736) with a remaining balance of \$107,692 (12% expended). To move forward on the 2020 project – the design of a well, the Association worked with the Office of the State Engineer on compliance issues and modifying their current water rights. The Association also had difficulty finding a property for the proposed well. The well design is moving forward, and the Association anticipates final design completion by the end of December 2022.

k) Union del Llano MDWCA, Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The Applicant has an outstanding 2021 award (\$1,700,000) with a current balance of \$1,680,195 (2% expended). The final design will be completed by December 2022 with the project anticipating going out to bid in January 2023.

1) Upper Rio Grande WSD, Flood Prevention Project, (Preliminary Target Drawdown)

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

Justification: The applicant has an outstanding 2021 award (\$300,000) with the full balance remaining (0% expended). The design is complete, and the project is ready for construction. The Association is currently awaiting drilling permits from the Office of the State Engineer.

Member Lucero made a motion, seconded by Member Russel to approve the above items a) through l) waiver requests of the WTB Policy requirement for the Preliminary Expenditure Target. The motion passed unanimously by a roll call vote.

7. <u>2023 Water Project Fund Application Presentations</u>. -Angela Quintana, Senior Program Administrator
