- 1. <u>Call to Order and Roll Call</u>. Chair Papen called the Colonias Infrastructure Board ("CIB") meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established.
- 2. <u>Approval of Agenda</u>. Member Deal made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Member Billingsley. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.

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- 3. <u>Approval of September 15, 2022, Board Minutes</u>. Member Baca-Argabright made a motion, seconded by Member Deal to approve the September 15, 2022, Board Minutes as presented. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.
- 4. Recognition of Service to the Colonias Board for Oscar Vasquez-Butler. Due to an unexpected appointment, Mr. Vasquez-Butler arrived after the CIB meeting was adjourned. The CIB presented Mr. Vasquez-Butler with a gift of appreciation for his service and dedication as a CIB Board Member since the program's inception in 2011 to 2021.
- 5. <u>Consideration of Allocation of Returned Funds.</u> presented by Ms. Angela Quintana, Sr. Program Administrator

Re-allocating returned funds from the 2022 Colonias Infrastructure Project Fund.

Section 6.3 of the Colonias Infrastructure Board ("CIB") Project Management Policies provides that full awards returned by the borrower or rescinded by the Board may be reallocated to a different qualified project. To be eligible for reallocated financial assistance, potential replacement qualified project(s) must have submitted a financial assistance application as part of the most recent funding cycle. Reallocated award monies may be utilized for the most recent cycle or held to be awarded at the next upcoming cycle.

The Colonias Board at its May 3, 2022, meeting, directed staff to set aside 5% of the 2022 Severance Tax Bond proceeds for possible shortfalls from the 2022 awarded projects. The full amount of the set-aside including an unawarded balance of \$26,017 is \$1,936,687.

The Village of Cloudcroft ("Village") was awarded funding in the 2022 Colonias funding cycle for the following projects:

- 5755-CIF22: water infrastructure project in an amount not to exceed \$210,000. The project was for designing and constructing/replacing waterlines, service taps, and fire hydrants from Curlew to Corona. The Village does not have the funds and/or workforce to replace and maintain the road to its original structure after replacing the infrastructure.
- 5756-CIF22: water infrastructure project in an amount not to exceed \$295,000. The project was for designing and constructing/replacing waterlines, service taps, and fire hydrants at Sugar Pine Road. The Village does not have the funds and/or workforce to replace and maintain the road to its original structure after replacing the infrastructure.

The Town of Hurley ("Town") was awarded funding in the 2022 Colonias funding cycle for the following project:

• 5773-CIF22: roads/drainage project in an amount not to exceed \$99,300. The project was for the survey and design of roadway improvements along Anza St. and Cortez Ave. The Town received NMDOT funding for the same scope and therefore no longer requires the Colonias funds.

Staff reviewed the 2022 list of applicants, and based on the list, those that were awarded for a phased amount (design only) and/or not awarded either require more funds than are available or have been secured or are

Colonias Infrastructure Board Board Meeting December 14, 2022 in the process of securing the funds. To prevent further delays in moving the projects forward, staff does not recommend using the returned funds to fund any projects from the current cycle.

For the upcoming 2023 Colonias cycle, the available funds are estimated at \$61.6 million. With the increase of funds for the upcoming cycle, staff does not recommend adding the additional \$604,300 from the returned funds to the 2023 cycle.

Construction projects are continuing to experience increased costs in equipment and materials. It is unclear whether the 2022 awards will see a steady and/or decrease in costs by the time the projects are underway. In preparation for possible continued increases, staff recommends adding the returned funding in the amount of \$604,300 to the set-aside for possible construction cost overruns for the 2022 awards.

Staff recommends that the Board waive the policies regarding reallocation of declined or rescinded awards and add the \$604,300 from the returned funds from the Village of Cloudcroft (2-\$505,000) and the Town of Hurley (\$99,300) to the set-aside for construction cost over-runs from the 2022 Colonias awards.

Member Baca-Argabright made a motion, seconded by Member Deal to approve re-allocating returned funds from the 2022 Colonias Infrastructure funding cycle as recommended by staff. The motion passed unanimously by a voice vote.
