New Mexico Finance Authority Water Trust Board Meeting October 24, 2023

- 1. Call to Order and Roll Call. Chairman Hamman called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. A quorum was established.
- 2. Approval of Agenda. Member Russel moved, seconded by Member Lucero, to approve the agenda. The motion passed 13-0.
- 3. Approval of October 3 & 4, 2023, Board Minutes. Member Sloane moved, seconded by Member Russel, for approval of the October 3 & 4, 2023, minutes, noting the two spelling errors will be corrected. The motion passed 13-0.
- 4. Scope Change for Eastern New Mexico Water Utility Authority ("ENMWUA") Project #WPF-5667.
 - 4.1 Ms. Quintana presented for consideration a scope change for ENMWUA. ENMWUA secured funding in December 2022, for a Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery project in an amount not to exceed \$14,510,522 (90% grant/ 10% loan). The approved scope of work is to design and construct a 15.5-mile transmission pipeline ("FW1") which will connect to Finished Water ("FW2"). In the 2023 WTB cycle, the ENMWUA was awarded \$13,900,000 for the design and construction of phases titled Raw Water 1, Raw Water 2, and Raw Water 3, including installation of 26 miles of pipeline. The Authority has been awarded federal funds in FY2022 and FY2023. These federal funds require a non-federal match. Below is the current breakdown of funding received:

The Capital Outlay funding (\$14,800,000) has a reversion date of June 2024. ENMWUA will use the Capital Outlay and federal funding to complete FW1. The ENMWUA is requesting a scope change for WPF-5667 on the next phase of the project titled: Raw Water ("RW") 1, 2, and 3 so there is not an overmatch of the non-federal match by using required state spenddown before federal funds.

The RW1, 2, and 3 project scopes were vetted through the 2023 application cycle-project WPF- 5952. The ENMWUA would combine WPF-5667 with WPF-5952. The ENMWUA intends to use all the funding effectively to move the project/phases forward without jeopardizing future federal and non-federal funding. The Project Review Committee has reviewed this request and concurs with staff's recommendation. Therefore, NMFA staff recommends approval of a scope change from Finished Water 1 ("FW1") to Raw Water 1, 2, and 3 ("RW1", "RW2" and "RW3") for Project No. WPF-5667.

Member Lucero made a motion, seconded by Member Kahl to approve agenda item 4.1. The motion passed 13-0.

5. Construction Cost Overrun Set-Aside.

5.1 Ms. Quintana presented an overview of the cost overrun set-aside. Fambrough MDWCA has returned funds from their 2023 award and the City of Santa Fe has returned funds from their 2022 award. Below is the current balance and proposed balances for the construction cost-overrun set-aside:

The Project Review Committee has reviewed this request and concurs with staff's recommendation for the City of Santa Fe 2022 returned funds be added to the set-aside for construction cost overruns for the 2022 WTB awardees and the 2023 returned funds for Fambrough MDWCA be added to the set-aside for construction cost overruns for the 2023 WTB awardees. Discussion ensued with staff clarifying that the NMFA intends to use the severance tax bonds first for draws and utilize the water trust fund distribution last for maximum flexibility.

Member Kahl made a motion, seconded by Member Lucero to approve agenda item 5.1. The motion passed 13-0.

- 6. 2024 Application Cycle, Recommendation of Projects for Legislative Authorization.
 - 6.1 2024 Application Cycle, Recommendation of Projects for Legislative. Ms. Quintana presented for consideration 65 projects to be recommended to the Legislature for authorization for potential funding from the Water Project Fund pursuant to The Water Project Finance Act.

Ms. Quintana went over the application criteria and evaluation process that began in early July 2023 with 67 applications totaling more than \$276.7 million were filed and one application was rescinded. In October 2023, 18 policy waivers (one planning; 17 Preliminary Expenditure Target) were presented for the Board's consideration. The WTB approved all waiver requests with the exception of the planning document waiver.

For the 2024 cycle, staff anticipates that a maximum of \$133.1 million will be available for projects. To ensure that the recommended list is appropriately sized to the amount of funds available and includes sufficient projects in case some of the highly ranked projects do not pass any part of the regulatory and/or policy compliance, or are "phased" to encompass a stand-alone, functional project that can be completed within a 2-year time period, staff recommends the Legislative Authorization list include all 65 projects totaling approximately 207% of the expected available funds.

Ms. Quintana went over the upcoming deadlines for applicants. Changes beginning in the 2023 application process required applicants to reach out to the Office of the State Engineer ("OSE") on regulatory compliance during the project application to allow additional time to resolve any compliance issues. The OSE has identified regulatory compliance issues with 14 applicants. Those 14 applicants have been notified of their compliance deadline.

The WTB Project Management Team will first review the waiver requests and a recommendation on the requests will be made to the WTB and its Project Review Committee at its April 3, 2024, meeting and to make final funding recommendations to the Board at its April 23, 2024, meeting.

NMFA staff brings forward all 65 projects for consideration to the Legislature for authorization for potential funding from the Water Project Fund. The Project Review Committee has reviewed and concurs with staff's recommendation.

Member Lucero made a motion, seconded by Member Kahl to approve agenda item 6.1 as presented. The motion passed 13-0.

Ms. Quintana relayed items 6.2 (Authorization Spreadsheet), 6.3 (Water Conversation), 6.4 (Flood Prevention), 6.5 (Water Storage), and 6.6 (Watersheds) were not action items and information pertaining to these items were provided in the board book. Ms. Quintana offered to answer any questions the Board may have from their review of the board book materials. No further discussion occurred.

7. New Mexico Unit Fund.

7.1 Chairman Hamman presented an update regarding the NM Unit Fund. For background, Legislative action was used to address the NM Unit Fund. The Unit Fund directed the WTB to be a pre-vetting process

to make recommendations to the interstate street commission for approval of specifics funds and priorities that are associated with the funds that were set aside through the Arizona Water Settlement Act, specifically the Gila River in the Southwest portion of the state. Committees impacted thereof ranges from irrigation district and mutual domestics in that region.

A task force, administered by the NMFA, will be created for purposes of pre-vetting the NM Unit Fund, establish criteria, create policies and processes for the authorization of the 100-million-dollar fund. The task force will provide their recommendations in the upcoming 2023 Legislative Session.

Chairman Hamman appointed Member Lucero as Vice Chair, Member Forte, Member Esparsen, and Member Russel to the task force. Chairman Hamman will serve as Chairman for this task force. NMFA staff will coordinate with these members to schedule the first meeting.

Chairman Hammam made a motion to approve the task force and the appointed members. Member Russel and Member Kahl seconded the motion. The motion passed 13-0.
