1. **Call to Order and Roll Call.** Vice Chair Forte called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. A quorum was established.
2. **Approval of Agenda.** Member Sloane moved, seconded by Member Russel, to approve the agenda. The motion passed 11-0.
3. **Approval of Board Minutes.**

3.1 Member Sloane moved, seconded by Member Van Dyke for approval of the August 27, 2025, minutes. The motion passed 11-0.

4. 2026 Water Project Fund Waiver Requests.

4.1 **Recommendations on 2026 Water Project Fund waiver requests.** Staff presented for consideration the 2026 WTB waiver requests to the WTB policies. Applicants unable to meet the expenditure target by September 2025 were instructed to include a waiver request in their application. Entities failing to meet the target and not granted a waiver will be disqualified from further evaluation. Additionally, applicants must submit planning documents demonstrating best practices. For this cycle, seven waiver requests were submitted for the planning document requirement and twenty-nine for the expenditure target.

4.2. La Jicarita DWA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: LA Jicarita’s current PER is from 2018 and past the 5-year requirement per WTB policy. The PER information is relevant to the current proposed design only project.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval of the waiver request.

4.3. City of Lovington – Wastewater, Conveyance and Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The City is in the process of working with their engineering firm for a PER on their entire wastewater system due to recent issues with the Wastewater Treatment Facility and funding from the EPA for upgrades/repairs.

Recommendation: No planning document(s) was provided within the application that could substantiate the feasibility of the project. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.4. Village of Magdalena – Wastewater, Conveyance and Deliver Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The Village anticipates having the final PER for the wastewater system by Phase 2 – readiness application (January 2026).

Recommendation: No planning document(s) was provided within the application that could substantiate the feasibility of the project. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.5. Town of Moriarty – Wastewater, Conveyance and Deliver Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The Town anticipates having the PER completed in November 2025.

Recommendation: No planning document(s) was provided within the application that could substantiate the feasibility of the project. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.6. Tranquillo Pines MDWCA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The Association is in the process of collecting data to provide the basis for the PER and other planning documents. The Association anticipates completion of a planning document by the ending of December 2025.

Recommendation: No planning document(s) was provided within the application that could substantiate the feasibility of the project. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.7. Vadito MDWCA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The Association submitted a draft PER within their application which is in its final stages pending approval and is in the process of collecting data to provide the basis for the PER and other planning documents. The Association anticipates final approval by early October 2025.

Recommendation: Although the PER is in draft form, the information provided substantiates the responses within the application of the proposed design project. NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.8. Village of Ruidoso – Wastewater Conveyance and Delivery Project.

Waiver Request: Planning Document Requirement

Justification: The Village has faced unprecedented challenges that have caused significant damage to the water and wastewater infrastructure. The proposed project is to relocate the sewer main from out of the river and floodway.

Recommendation: The project, if awarded, will address conditions declared an emergency as provided within the WTB policies. NMFA staff recommends approval.

Member Russel made a motion to approve all planning waivers for 4.2 through 4.8, seconded by Member Lucero. The motion passed 10-1. Member Sloane opposed.

4.9. Village of Ruidoso – Flood Prevention, Water Storage Conveyance and Delivery.

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Village has two outstanding 2024 awards (Tank restoration and Waterline replacement) with a combined total of \$4,833,640 (44% expended). The Tank restoration project went out to bid and a contractor was selected but was unable to begin due to the start of the monsoons. The waterline project was moving forward but also had to stop construction until the monsoon season ends. Both projects are anticipated to move forward towards completion within the next few months.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.10. Albuquerque Bernalillo CWUA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery.

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: At the time of the application submission, September 11, 2025, the Authority had 2022 (1), 2023 (1), and 2024 (3) outstanding awards that did not meet the 70% expenditure target. Currently, the Authority has met the 70% preliminary expenditure target.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.11. Village of Angel Fire – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Village has an outstanding 2023 (tank replacement) award (\$1,364,609) with a current balance of \$474,307 (65% expended). The Village is awaiting final close-out documents to be completed within the next few weeks.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.12. Canon MDWC&SWA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has an outstanding 2023 (Design-waterlines) award (\$350,000) with a current balance of \$171,911 (49% expended). The Association anticipates completion of the design project by March 2026. The Association was awarded \$4.8 million in 2024 for waterline replacements. The Association has determined that a rate increase and debt associated with the award is an impractical burden to the members of the system and has returned the 2024 award.

Recommendation: Staff reached out to the Association with a recommendation to reduce the 2024 award and to remind the Association that there was no guarantee of funding in the current cycle for their waterline replacement. NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.13. Capulin MDWCA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has an outstanding 2024 (Design-system improvements) award with the full balance of \$500,000 (\$0 expended). The Association required additional alternatives within the PER which delayed the project from moving forward. The Association anticipates beginning the 2024 project in late October 2025.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.14. Claunh Pinto SWCD – Watershed Restoration and Management Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The district has two 2023 and two 2024 awards with a combined total of \$2,400,000 (28% expended). The district anticipates full expenditure of the 2023 awards by the ending of December 2025 and full expenditure of the 2024 awards by December 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.15. Dona Ana County – Flood Prevention

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The County has a 2024 (Construct-Dragonfly Channel) award that has the full balance of \$5,000,000 remaining (\$0 expended). The project has been awarded, but due to this year's heavy monsoon activity, the saturated field conditions prohibited the contractor from moving forward. The County anticipates the project moving forward at the ending of September with a final completion date of October 2026

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.16. Eastern NMWUA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 35%

Justification: The Authority has 2023 and 2024 awards with a combined total of \$33.9 million (23% expended). The 2023 project is under construction with 100% expenditure anticipated by December 2025. The 2024 project is currently in early design phase and is anticipated to be fully expended by December 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.17. Eldorado Area WSD – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The district has 2023 and 2024 awards with a combined total of \$1,250,000 (3% expended). The 2023 award was awarded to the only bidder in late 2024. Due to extended lead times on materials, the contractor was granted an extension request to resume on July 6, 2025. The Association anticipates completion of the project by the ending of November 2025. The 2024 award went out to bid in June 2025 and was awarded in July. The construction start date is anticipated to begin in early October with an anticipated completion date of January 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.18. EMWT Regional WA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Projects

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has an outstanding 2022 award with the full balance remaining \$491,050 (0% expended). The 2022 design project was delayed primarily to the Association not having adequate water rights. The design is in the final stages of completion with an estimated time of late October for submission of approval to NMED.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.19. City of Farmington – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The City has a 2024 award for \$20,000,000 (26% expended). The project is currently under construction with an anticipated 70% expenditure being met by February 2026 and an anticipated project completion date of July 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.20. City of Gallup – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery.

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 35%

Justification: The City has 2023 and 2024 awards with a combined total of \$11,348,064 (16% expended). The 2023 award is moving forward with the construction of G-80 water wells, wellhouses and electrical/pump assembly. The project may be delayed due to the acquisition of electrical switch gear for the submersible pump that may take up to 24 months for delivery. The 2024 project was awarded for design. The city paid for the design and will seek a change of scope for construction purposes.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.21. Greater Chimayo MWCDA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has a 2022 award for \$825,000 (19% expended). After completing the design, the project went out to bid in May 2024 with no bids being received. The Association re-advertised, and the only bid received came in at \$600,000 more than the available funds. The Association’s engineer simplified the design and went out to bid in July 2025. The project has now been awarded with the expectation of project completion within 3 to 6 months.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.22. Guadalupe SWCD – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery.

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The District has two 2023 awards with a combined total of \$650,000 (51% expended). The Pecos River watershed is pending final documents to complete the project. Due to the complex area within the Pintada watershed, the project required specialized technical design which delayed the project. Both projects are anticipated to be completed by December 2025.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.23. City of Las Cruces – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has a 2024 award with the full balance \$3,000,000 (0% expended). The city delayed the closing of the funds due to internal resolution language. The 2024 award is scheduled to close on November 2025. The project is anticipated to begin in May of 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.24. Lincoln County – Flood Prevention Project – 70%

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target

Justification: The County has a 2024 award with the full balance \$1,190,000 (0% expended). The project was delayed due to the recent fires and floods in the area. The project went out to bid in late August. Once the contractor has been approved, the County anticipates completion of the project by June 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.25. Luna County – Flood Prevention Project – 70%

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target

Justification: The County has 2022 and 2023 awards with a combined total of \$4,600,000 (27% expended). The 2022 project (Land Port of Entry Diversion Berm) was delayed due to ROW and NMDOT permitting. It is moving forward and is anticipated to be completed by January 2026. The 2023 project (China Draw E. Florida flood mitigation) is moving forward with an anticipated completion date of December 2025.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.26. McKinley County – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The County has 2024 project with a full balance of \$3,150,000 (0% expended). The County has contracted engineering services to move the project out for bid. The County anticipates awarding the contract in late October.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.27. Pendaries Village MDWCA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has 2023 and 2024 awards with a combined total of \$7,499,999 (5% expended). The Association has not secured the 2024 funding due to not completing the design awarded in the 2023 project. The design was delayed due to complications on ROW easements and ownership from the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon fire. In 2025, the Association was awarded \$2,000,000 for design/construct waterline replacements. In June 2025, the Association returned the funds stating one of the reasons was changes in priorities for the next phase of improvements.

Recommendation: The Association needs to move forward towards securing the 2024 funds and managing that project to completion. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.28. City of Portales – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The City has two 2024 awards with a combined total of \$4,076,135 (5% expended). These projects were delayed primarily to administrative turnover and negotiations between the engineering firm and the City council. Currently, the projects are moving forward with an anticipated substantial completion by early 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.29. Ramah WSD – Wastewater Conveyance and Treatment Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The District has a 2024 award with the full balance of \$440,000 (0% expended). The district is currently working with McKinley County on this design project to move forward.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.30. City of Raton – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has a 2024 award with the full balance of \$1,250,000 (0% expended). The project was awarded with a Notice to Proceed commencing on August 11, 2025. The project is anticipated to be completed within 120 days or December 2025.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.31. City of Roswell – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has two 2024 awards with a combined total of \$17,602,273 (5% expended). The Hobson Rd. flood project will begin construction in late Fall 2025. The reservoir rehab is approximately 27% complete with an anticipated project completion by February 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.32. Sangre de Cristo Regional MDWC&SWA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has 2023 and 2024 awards with a combined total of \$2,047,600 (13% expended). Both projects were delayed by the previous engineering firm. The Association has since hired a different engineer and both projects are moving forward. Construction began in June 2025 with an anticipated completion date of January 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.33. City of Santa Fe – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Projects

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has three 2024 awards with a combined total of \$15,250,000 (36% expended). The awarded projects were delayed from closing due to the city requesting various changes in the funding agreement language and process. The city intends to move forward on the projects quickly once the funding has been secured.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.34. City of Santa Rosa – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has an outstanding 2024 award \$2,150,000 (3% expended). Due to duplication efforts of the same project, the city requested and was approved an expansion of the original scope to include additional streets for waterline replacements. The design is anticipated to be completed by November with construction beginning in March of 2026 and substantial completion of the project by August 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.35. Storrie Project WUA – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Projects

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Association has a 2023 award with the full balance of \$13,800,000 (0% expended). The design of this 2023 project is currently underway. Due to the 2026 irrigation season, the construction will not begin until Fall 2026.

Recommendation: The Association needs to move forward towards completing the 2023 award and managing that project to completion. NMFA staff does not recommend approval.

4.36. City of Sunland Park – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery; Flood Prevention

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has an outstanding 2024 award \$450,000 (8% expended). This design project is underway with an anticipated 70% expenditure by late October and completion by March 2026.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.37. Village of Taos Ski Valley – Water Storage, Conveyance and Delivery Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The Village has an outstanding 2024 award for \$1,575,000 (8% expended). The multi-design phased award currently has the design of phase I approximately 95% complete. The intent of the Village is to seek construction funds for ph. 1 (2026 application) while working on the design for phases II-V (2024 award).

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

4.38. City of Truth or Consequences – Wastewater Conveyance and Treatment Project

Waiver Request: Preliminary Expenditure Target – 70%

Justification: The city has a 2024 award with a full balance of \$16,000,000 (0% expended). This design is on schedule to be completed by April 2026 and out to bid in June 2026 with an anticipated 18-month construction duration.

Recommendation: NMFA staff recommends approval.

The Project Review Committee concurs with staff’s recommendation to approve the waiver request recommendations as presented.

Member Sloane made a motion to approve waivers for 4.8 through 4.38, seconded by Member Esparsen. Item 4.27 was not approved. The motion passed 11-0.
